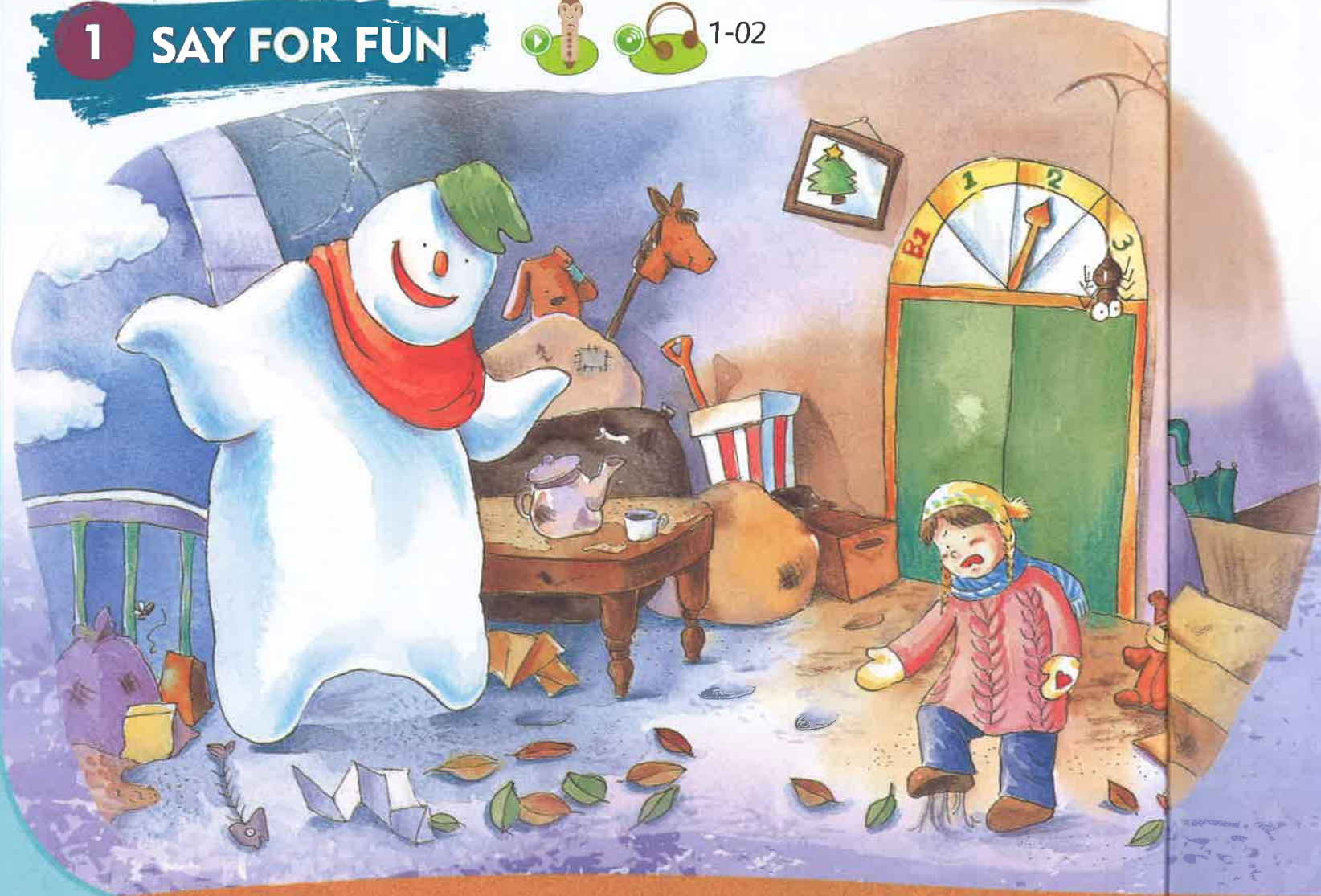

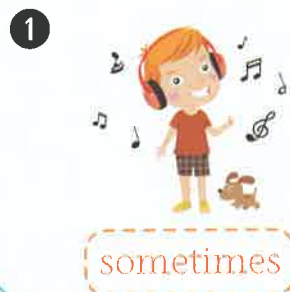

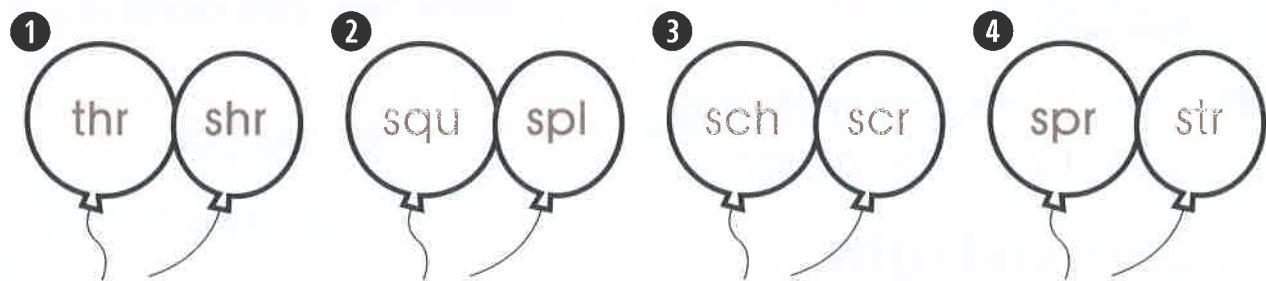

The lion laughs and says, "How can a little mouse help a big lion?"

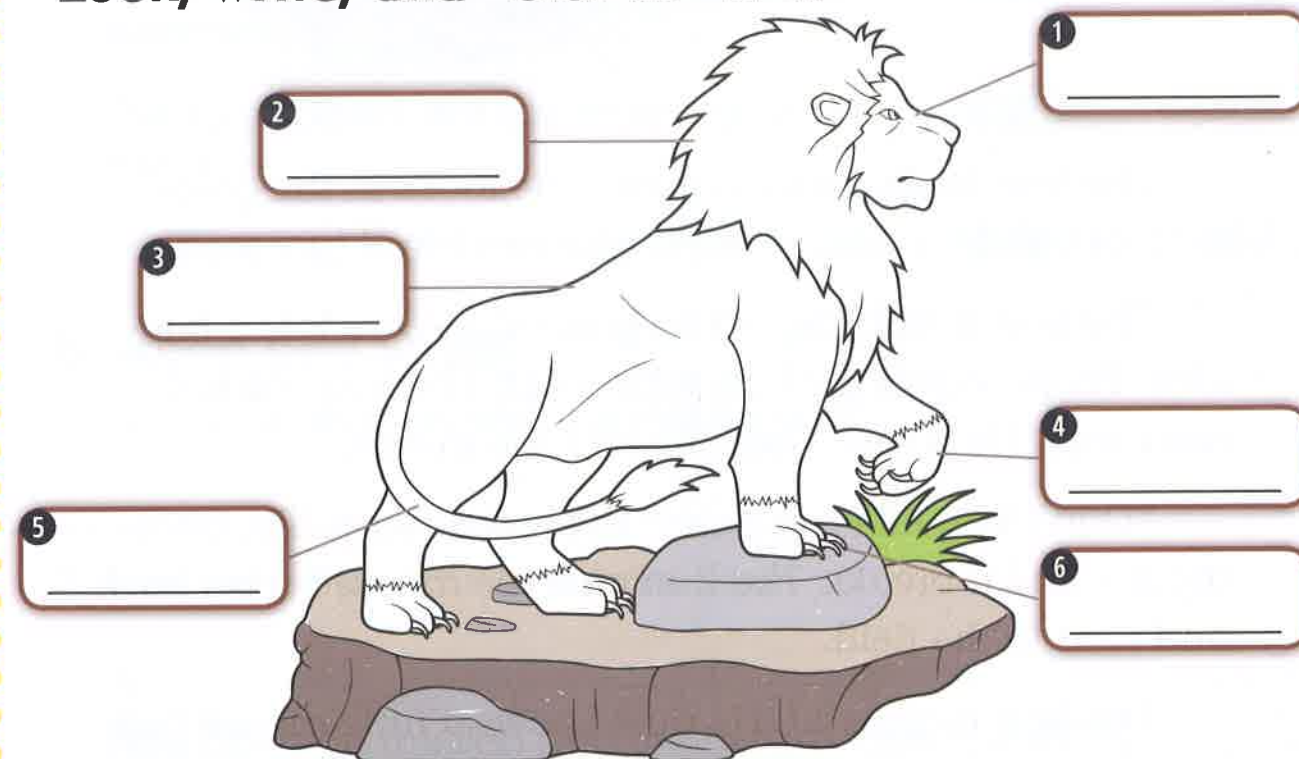
The lion thinks the mouse is funny and lets her go.
